Introduction and history

 Scrub typhus, is an acute infectious disease of variable severity that is transmitted to humans by an arthropod vector of the Trombiculidae family.

- "Tsutsuga" means small and dangerous.
- "mushi" means insect or mite.

Burden of disease

- Scrub typhus is confined geographically to the Asia Pacific region, a billion people are at risk and nearly a million cases are reported every year.
- It affects people of all ages including children.
 Humans are accidental hosts in this zoonotic disease.

Scrub Typhus

 The term "scrub" is used because of the type of vegetation (terrain between woods and clearings) that harbors the vector.

 The word "typhus" is derived from the Greek word "typhus", which means "fever with stupor".
